GETTING HERE

BY AIR

The Ningaloo Reef is a short 1.45hr flight from Perth. Qantas Link air service operates daily flights from Perth to Learmonth (Exmouth) Airport. Flights can change during the different times of the year, visit qantas.com.au to stay up to date with the current flight schedule.

Learmonth Airport is located 36km from Exmouth. A shuttle bus, private car transfer or hire cars are available to you to your accommodation.

BY ROAD

By road, Exmouth is situated 1,270km from Perth. Adventure along the Coral Coast Highway and discover some of Western Australia's best known and most loved attractions. The Coral Coast Highway is known as one of Australia's Great Scenic Drives. The excellent road conditions make for the ideal self-drive journey.

Not a driver? You can also travel via coach. Integrity Coach Lines provide scheduled coach services between Perth and Broome stopping at numerous towns along the way.



TRAVELLER TIP:
Take regular breaks, the journey from Perth is a long stretch of road. Be sure to stop along the way and take in the sites. Take note of the speed limit signs along the way. Maximum speed limit is 110kph and 50kph in built up areas.

FOOD & DRINK



HISTORY

The Ningaloo Coast is part of the Baiyungu, Yinikurtira and Thalanyji peoples' traditional land and sea country and maintains significant cultural values. In December 2019 the Gnulli Native Title claim covering some 69,000 square kilometres including the Shire of Exmouth and Ningaloo Coast region was successfully determined. Working closely with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions these traditional owner groups are managing the conservation and recreation reserves along the spectacular Ningaloo Coast to ensure the area is protected and remains accessible to the public now and into the future.

ARTS

The Ningaloo is home to many amateur and professional artists, practising all forms of art. Take the time to immerse yourself in the local Cultural Arts Centre and Galleries to see a true representation of the artisan groups of Exmouth.

MARKETS

Wander through the local markets held monthly from April to October in Federation Park, featuring local produce, food trucks, live music and handcrafted art and souvenirs. You will be sure to discover the perfect treasure to remember your special time on the Ningaloo Reef.

DECEMBER - FEBRUARY

TURTLE NESTING

Three of the world's seven species of turtles are found in waters off the Ningaloo Reef. These ancient marine creatures boast significant cultural and spiritual importance to coastal Indigenous Australians.

Marine turtles generally live for a long time and are slow to reach sexual maturity. December marks the beginning of the laying season here on the Ningaloo Reef. Our pristine coastline fills with male and female turtles' return to the region where they were born to mate and nest. Watch in awe as the huge mature females exit the water for one of the only times to bask in the sun and lay between one and 10 clutches of 30 to 180 eggs!



TRAVELLER TIP: Learn the do's and don'ts when observing our delicate turtle population. By attending a Turtle Education Tour you are helping to conserve our marine turtle population.

JANUARY - MARCH

TURTLE HATCHLINGS

From January through to March, the Ningaloo Coast Line's warm sands begin to erupt with thousands of baby turtle hatchlings. With 10,000 turtle nests dug every year along the Ningaloo coast jump on a night tour for the opportunity to watch the baby turtles make their way to the ocean for the first time.

SUNSET CRUISING

The calm waters of the Exmouth Gulf is the perfect location to enjoy a romantic sunset cruise. Depending on the time of year, you may also have the opportunity to observe the humpback mothers with their young. The young humpbacks are incredibly inquisitive and playful. A wonderful experience to end your day on the Ningaloo.

WHALE SHARKS

The once in a lifetime bucket list opportunity - swimming with the biggest fish in the ocean in the warm water off the Ningaloo Reef. These enormous but harmless filter feeders can grow up to 18m long. They cruise the world's oceans in search of concentrations of plankton to feed on, and the Ningaloo Reef is one of the only places on the planet they appear regularly in large numbers.

MARCH - AUGUST

MANTA RAYS

Like the whale shark, manta rays are filter feeders that feast on the large amounts of zooplankton and coral spawn found along the Ningaloo Reef.

Coral Bay is a manta ray hot spot, with a resident population of mantas. Coral Bay can be reached by road, a 1.5hr trip easily done as a day trip from Exmouth. The waters off Exmouth also play host to manta rays, with numbers at their highest between May and November.

Visitors have the chance to swim and interact with manta rays on dedicated manta ray snorkel tours that operate throughout the year.

MAY - NOVEMBER



DIVING & SNORKELLING

Submerge yourself and discover the underwater world of the Ningaloo Reef. The Ningaloo Reef has something for everyone. Suba dive the Muiron Islands or the world-famous Exmouth Navy Pier, or snorkel at the award-winning turquoise bay, oyster stacks or lakeside locations you will be blown away with the vast array of species including over 500 species of fish and 250 types of coral.

ALL YEAR ROUND



WILDFLOWERS

Wander through the ancient trails of Charles Knife Gorge and discover the vibrant collection of wildflowers. The Cape Range National Park is home to 100 species of land birds, native marsupials and around 630 species of flowering plants.

Keep an eye out for the vibrant red Sturt's desert pea, mulla mullas, wattles, everlastings, native fuchsias, fan flowers and Dampiera along your journey.

JUNE - AUGUST



TRAVELLER TIP: The Vlamingh Head Lighthouse is one of only a few places on the Australian coast where you can witness both the sunrise and sunset. Make the most of it and why not pack a picnic?

YARDIE CREEK

Make your way around the Cape and down to Yardie Creek. Take the walking trail on the northern side of Yardie Creek, stop to enjoy the mind-blowing view that overlooks Yardie Creek all the way down to the Ningaloo Reef. For a different perspective hop on board a boat tour to take in the sheer red cliffs of Yardie Creek from down below. Don't forget to look closely during your visit, you may be lucky enough to spot the endangered black-footed rock wallabies as they shelter on ledges along the southern cliff face.

MARCH - NOVEMBER
